Though the petitioner is stated to have now joined the investigation, learned State counsel has produced in Court today a list of about 22 criminal cases shown to be registered against the petitioner, all of which are for the commission of offences shown to be committed under the provisions of Mines and Minerals (Regulation of Development) Act, 1957, though in some cases the petitioner was only imposed a fine for the commission of such offences. In two cases, he is also alleged to have committed an offence punishable under Section 379 of the IPC .

Learned State counsel has further submitted that the petitioner already stands arrested in connection with FIR No. 48 dated 18.02.2019, registered at Police Station Pinjore itself, for the commission of a similar offence.

That being so and with the co-accused of the petitioner, i.e. Alam Khan, having also produced in Court today an affidavit stating that four vehicles belonging to Alam Khan were in fact rented out to the petitioner on 01.04.2019, I do not find any ground to continue the interim order passed in favour of the petitioner.

Consequently, the present petition is dismissed, with interim order dated 25.04.2019 vacated.
