This petition has been filed by the petitioner against the orders of the Courts below. By order Annexure P-2 the trial Court has dismissed an application under Section 311 Cr.P.C. and by order Annexure P-5 the Revision Court has dismissed the revision on the ground that no revision lay.

Brief facts of the case are that the petitioner had filed a complaint alleging that the respondents No. 2 to 4 had trespassed into a plot owned by her and had stolen some old bricks.

The case of the respondents No. 2 to 4 on the other hand was that the petitioner was not the owner and this was an ancestral property where a lot of litigation is pending including suit for partition. The suit filed by the petitioner has been dismissed and thereafter, her husband had filed a suit which is still pending. By the application the Courts below also noticed that documents which were now sought to be proved by the

petitioner had been relied upon by the petitioner in her suit. The Courts also noticed that no reference was made to this document when the petitioner and her son was examined and consequently, dismissed the application.

I find no reason to interfere in the findings of the Courts below. Consequently, petition stands dismissed.

Since the main case has been dismissed, the pending criminal miscellaneous application, if any, also stands dismissed as such.
