Petitioner Randeep Singh @ Mota has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.127 dated 13.09.2018, registered at Police Station Kamboj, Amritsar Rural, under Sections 379-B, 411 and 201 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued.

Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

As per the FIR, the complainant had withdrawn ₹1,00,000/- from the bank. Out of the said amount, he had paid ₹60,000/- to the stones seller and he had kept the remaining amount of ₹40,000/- in his pocket. At about 3:30 p.m. , when he was going to his fields, in the meantime, two cut-haired young men came on motorcycle and by showing him datar, they

snatched the money.

The present petitioner is nominated in this case on the basis of extra judicial confession made by him. The co-accused in the similar circumstances has already been granted benefit of bail.

The petitioner has been in custody since 17.10.2018. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case may take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping him in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed on parity and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
