AVNEESH JHINGAN, J (Oral):

The present contempt petition has been filed pleading
wilful disobedience of order dated 30.05.2018 passed by this Court
in CRM-M No.24015 of 2018.

The relevant portion of the order is reproduced as under:-

"Notice of motion.

*2. Petitioners are stated to be major and they
wanted to marry each other. However, it is being objected by
respondents No.4 to 6. In this regard, a representation dated
28.5.2018 (Annexure P-1) is submitted to the Senior
Superintendent of Police, Amritsar Rural. Since petitioners are
only seeking for issuance of direction to the official
respondents, therefore, service of notice to respondents No.4
to 6 is dispensed.*

3. On the asking of the Court, Ms. Rajni Gupta, Sr.

D.A.G. Punjab, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondents State. Learned counsel for the petitioners is directed to furnish requisite sets of paper-book to the learned counsel for the respondents-State during the course of the day.

4. Accordingly, petition is disposed of with a direction to the official respondents to take necessary action on the petitioners' representation at the earliest."

Replies filed by respondents No.1 to 3 are taken on record. Copy of replies are handed over to learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned State counsel submits that representation was looked into but as per allegations, petitioners (in the writ petition) were not found on the given address. Later on, FIR was registered against the petitioner (in contempt petition) on statement of Manpreet Kaur (one of the petitioner in CRM-M No.24015 of 2018) and he is in custody.

In view of above, learned counsel for the petitioner states that no cause of action survives for pursuing the contempt petition. However, he seeks liberty to avail remedies in accordance with law.

The contempt petition is disposed of with liberty as prayed for.

The rule issued against the respondents stands discharged.
