The petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.61 dated 26.04.2016 under Sections 307, 336, 323, 506, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code ('IPC' - for short) and Section 25 of the Arms Act registered at Police Station Sadar Amritsar, District Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the allegations against the petitioners in the FIR are that the injuries, which are attributed to the petitioners, are on the hand and wrist of the complainant. He also contends that the matter had earlier been compromised and a petition for quashing on the basis of compromise bearing CRM-M No.46411 of 2018 had been filed wherein the counsel for the complainant had also put in appearance in support of the compromise. However, the complainant later on resiled from the compromise. He also contends that Section 307 IPC has been added and it is

alleged that the petitioners had fired in the air but no empty was recovered. He further contends that the petitioners are in their early twenties and are not involved in any other case

This Court, by the order dated 30.04.2019, had directed the petitioners to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of their arrest, they were ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Sudesh Kumar, states that the petitioners have joined investigation and are not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioners and keeping in view the fact that the petitioners have joined investigation, the order dated 30.04.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute.

However, the petitioners shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. They shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
