Present petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case bearing FIR No.103 dated 24.08.2016, under Sections 399, 402, 379 & 411 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (*for short 'IPC'*) and Sections 25/54/59 of the Arms Act, registered at Police Station City Sunam, District Sangrur.

This Court, on 03.05.2019, passed the following order:-

“ Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that on account of some misunderstanding, the petitioner could not appear before the learned trial Court on 22.02.2019 and that led to the cancellation of bail bonds/surety bonds as well as issuance of warrants. He further contends that the petitioner is ready to join proceedings before the learned trial Court.

Adjourned to 24.07.2019.

In the meantime, petitioner is directed to surrender before the trial Court and the trial Court shall release the petitioner on interim bail, till the next date of hearing, subject to its satisfaction. ”

Contends that in terms of above order, petitioner has already joined the proceedings and regularly appearing before learned trial Court.

 The aforesaid factual position is duly acknowledged by learned State Counsel, on instructions from ASI Hakam Singh.

 In view of above, interim order dated 03.05.2019 is made absolute subject to the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. and the present petition stands disposed off.

 It is made clear that the petitioner shall fully co-operate with the learned trial Court and would not repeat such lapse(s) in future.

 The observations, made above, may not be considered as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
