This order shall dispose of CRM-M-18719-2019, filed by
petitioner-Mohit Arora @ Aarush Arora, and CRM-M-22926-2019, filed

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by petitioner-Sania, under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in a case FIR No.14 dated 23.01.2019, registered at Police Station City Rajpura, District Patiala, under Section 306 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion was issued. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of the respondent-State and complainant also appeared through his counsel. They contested both these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

As per the allegations of prosecution, Deepak Kumar, husband of petitioner-Sania, committed suicide as Sania had illicit relations with petitioner-Mohit Arora and they also gave threat to the deceased.

The petitioners have been in custody since 20.02.2019. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of case may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, both these criminal miscellaneous petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of

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Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of
the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
