The petitioner competed in the selection process for appointment to the post of Civil Judge (Jr. Divn.) advertised on 20.03.2017 (**Annexure P-5**) in the category of Dependent of Freedom Fighters apart from General Category. The selection process for the total 109 posts advertised comprised of a preliminary examination, main examination and viva voce. The petitioner is stated to have qualified the preliminary examination in the Freedom Fighters Category and thus was permitted to undertake the HCS (JB) Examination conducted from 15.03.2019 to 17.03.2019. The result was declared on 11.04.2019, whereby only 9 candidates have been notified to have cleared the main examination and thus permitted to join the selection process for viva voce against 109 advertised posts.

The grievance of the petitioner is directed against rigorous standard of evaluation and is claiming re-evaluation of her answer-sheet.

On the previous date of hearing, counsel for the Haryana Public Service Commission was directed to produce the recruitment rule as also the rules/procedure for conduct of the examination including re-evaluation, if any.

At the time of resumed hearing today, it is conceded that there is no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-sheets of the main examination contemplated under the rules. However, counsel for the parties are agreed that no further adjudication is required in the present writ petition in view of Hon'ble the Supreme Court being seized of the issue of the standard of evaluation in view of pending **Writ Petition (Civil) No.565 of 2019** titled as **Pranav Verma and others Vs. The Registrar General of High Court of Punjab and Haryana at Chandigarh and anr.**

At this stage, counsel for the petitioner prays for permission to withdraw the writ petition.

Dismissed as withdrawn.
