Petitioners-Ajaypal Singh @ Anju and Jarmanjit Singh @ Jarmal have filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.18 dated 25.03.2019, registered at Police Station Kacha Pacca, District Tarn Taran, under Sections 379-B and 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

Complainant has also appeared through his counsel.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

Learned counsel for the petitioners argues that parties have already effected compromise and a quashing petition on the basis of compromise filed by the petitioners is already pending wherein the parties have been directed to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court for recording their statements qua compromise.

The petitioners have been in custody since 27.03.2019. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of case may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case, especially in view of the fact that compromise has been effected between the parties.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
