The petitioner has approached this Court seeking issuance of direction to respondents No.2 and 3 to take criminal action against respondents No.4 to 8, who have allegedly committed offences punishable under Sections 420, 468, 471 and 120-B of Indian Penal Code.

A prayer for issuance of a direction for registration of FIR has also been made therein.

The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner as well as private respondents No.4 to 6 own adjacent properties situated at Amrik Singh Road, Bathinda and that there used to remain a dispute amongst the parties leading to institution of several civil and criminal cases. It has been submitted that a demarcation of the respective properties was got conducted and the Naib Tehsildar had visited the spot alongwith his team and had conducted demarcation on 3.7.2006 in the presence of both the parties, but the private respondents No.4 to 6, however,

challenged the same before higher authorities upto the Court of Financial Commissioner, but the demarcation report was upheld.

It has further been submitted that infact private respondents No.4 to 6 challenged the demarcation report by way of filing a civil suit, which was also dismissed. It has further been submitted that during the pendency of the civil suit, private respondents No.4 to 6 transferred some part of the property, which was actually owned by the petitioner, to respondents No.7 and 8 and although an application dated 14.7.2018 (Annexure P-7) was made to the police but no action has been taken thereupon.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the petition the petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Bathinda to look into the matter and to dispose of the representation dated 14.7.2018 Annexure P-7, moved by petitioner at the earliest preferably within a period of three months from today, in accordance with law while taking into account the position as regards the revenue record in respect of the properties in question.

A copy of this order alongwith representation dated 14.7.2018 Annexure P-7 be sent to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Bathinda, so as to enable him to do the needful expeditiously.
