This order shall dispose of CRM-M-19722-2019, filed by
petitioner-Parveen alias Bina and CRM-M-18959-2019, filed by

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petitioner-Sanjay, under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.267 dated 02.09.2018, registered at Police Station Uchana, District Jind, under Sections 307, 452, 506 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Notice of motion has been issued in both these petitions. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the FIR, two persons fired shots at the complainant and one of them was Ajay Kumar.

Learned counsel for the petitioners have brought to the notice of this Court that complainant-injured has already been examined in the Court and not supported the prosecution version and turned hostile. He has specifically stated that the accused present in the Court have not fired shot upon him.

Learned State counsel has brought to the notice of this Court that it is a case of no injury.

The petitioners are in custody since 17.10.2018. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of case may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

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Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, both these criminal miscellaneous petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
