Petitioner seeks a mandamus for directing respondents No. 2 i.e.Punjab State Pharmacy Council, Mohali, to enter/register the petitioner as a Pharmacist.

Counsel submits that the petitioner passed the Bachelor in Pharmacy (Degree Course) from the I.K. Gujral, Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar in May 2018.

It is the contention raised by counsel that the petitioner possesses the requisite qualifications so as to be registered as Pharmacist under the provisions of Pharmacy Act 1948 and inspite of an application having been made for such purpose on 01.08.2018 (Annexure P-2) alongwith all supporting documents, the requisite registration has not been done and neither has any order been passed declining the claim of the petitioner.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Sahil Sharma, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 and 2 and waives service. A complete copy of the writ

paper-book already stands furnished to him.

Statement of Mr. Sahil Sharma, DAG, Punjab, is recorded to the effect that in case an application of the petitioner for registration as a Pharmacist with the Punjab State Pharmacy Council is pending, the same would be processed in accordance with law and under the provisions of Pharmacy Act, 1948 and a decision in regard thereto would be conveyed to the petitioner within a period of two months from today.

In the light of such statement recorded of learned State counsel, no further directions are required to be passed.
