Report dated 10.04.2019 of the learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Amritsar has been received whereby after recording statements of respondent No.2-Ritu and accused/petitioner, namely, Vijay Kumar, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of their own free will, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Moreover, the parties have resolved their dispute and have made statements that they have compromised the matter as per Annexure P-2 and shall abide by the same.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offence for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No. 377 dated 03.10.2014 registered at Police Station A-Division, Amritsar City, under Sections 498-A IPC, and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioner are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
