FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (Oral)

This order shall dispose off a petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR 288 dated 16.07.2015 (Annexure P-1) under Sections 498-A, 406, 323 and 506 IPC registered at Police Station Sector 31 Faridabad, on the basis of compromise.

The private parties to this petition have put in appearance before this Court and during the course of interaction with the parties, it transpired that they have compromised the matter voluntarily, out of their own free will, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure

and resolved to end the dispute. Their statements to that effect recorded separately.

In the light of joint statement made by the parties and together with the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offence for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed. FIR 288 dated 16.07.2015 (Annexure P-1) under Sections 498-A, 406, 323 and 506 IPC registered at Police Station Sector 31 Faridabad and all other consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioner is quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
