AVNEESH JHINGAN, J (Oral):

The present contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful disobedience of order dated 13.03.2018 passed by this Court in CWP No.14665 of 2014.

The relevant portion of the order is reproduced below:-

“In view of the admission made by the State counsel, the writ petition is allowed; it is ordered that the petitioner be promoted from the due date and all monetary and other consequential benefits be passed on her, within three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the judgment.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from Mr. Kanwalpreet Singh, Junior Assistant, O/o Director, Animal Husbandry, Punjab states that needful has been done. He has

produced order dated 22.08.2019, wherein it has been held that petitioner is entitled to monetary benefits and arrears have become due as a result of her promotion. He further submits that payment due will be paid and calculation provided to the petitioner within four weeks from today.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that no cause of action survives for pursuing the contempt petition.

The contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous. In case the statement made today in the Court is not adhered to, the petitioner would be at liberty to revive the contempt petition. In case the petitioner is forced to do so, exemplary costs may be imposed which shall be recoverable from the defaulting officers/officials personally.
