The present contempt petition has been filed alleging wilful disobedience of the order dated 17.04.2017 passed by this Court in CWP No. 23600 of 2014. The operative part of the order is reproduced below:

“The matter is remitted back to the Collector to decide the eviction petition filed by the respondents afresh. In view of the observations given herein, I intend to impose time-line as much time has left in this process.

Parties through their counsel are directed to appear before the Collector on 10.05.2017.

This Court is sanguine of the fact that Collector shall decide the eviction petition by affording 4-4 opportunities to the parties and shall decide the matter within a period of 10 months.

With the aforementioned observations, present writ petition stands disposed of.”

Learned counsel for the respondent submits that the eviction proceedings have been concluded by the SDO-cum-Collector, Karnal.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in view of the statement made in Court today, no cause of action survives for pursuing the contempt petition. However, he seeks liberty to avail remedies in accordance with law, if some grievance still survives.

Disposed of as infructuous with liberty as prayed for.

Rule issued against the respondent is discharged.
