This petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 438 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.0069 dated 20.04.2019 under Sections 420 and 409 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 registered at Police Station Sadar Hoshiarpur, District Hoshiarpur. The petitioner apprehended his arrest at the hands of Police.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has invited the attention of the Court to the order dated 06.05.2019 whereby while issuing notice of motion to the respondent-State, the interim protection was extended to the petitioner. The said order reads as under:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegations of embezzlement are not sustainable against petitioner Jaswinder Pal, who was working as Gramin Dak Sevak Mail Packer (GDSMP) and his job was to handle the posts. According to him, the petitioner has

been indicted on the ground that the unauthorized absence of the incharge of the Post Office, namely, Rajinder Kumar, was not intimated by him to the higher authorities. Further reliance has been placed upon CRM-M-20084-2019, whereby interim pre-arrest bail was granted to co-accused Anubhav Sethi.

Meanwhile, the petitioner shall join the investigation and would come present as and when called for and in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be admitted to interim bail on his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner further contends that in deference to the said order, the petitioner submitted himself before the Police and joined the investigation. According to him, the petitioner cooperated with the Police Authorities during the investigation and furnished requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer.

Learned State counsel who is assisted by ASI Balbir Singh does not dispute this fact that the petitioner has joined the investigation. Learned counsel on instructions from ASI Balbir Singh further states that the petitioner is not required for custodial interrogation for the time being.

Considering above, the petition is allowed and the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 06.05.2019 is made absolute.
