The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.4 dated 19.01.2019, under Sections 447/511/427/379/120-B IPC, registered at Police Station Kaathgarh, District SBS Nagar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that allegations against the petitioner in the FIR are that he is alleged to have forcibly cut 80 plants of *Safaida*. He further contends that the dispute between the petitioner and the complainant is with regard to the demarcation of land. He also contends that the mother of the petitioner had earlier filed CWP No.11975 of 2018 for issuance of direction to the District Collector to demarcate the land which is pending adjudication on 18.07.2019. He also contends that a similarly situated co-accused, namely Gurmukh Singh has already been granted *ad interim* bail by this Court in CRM-M-10508 of 2019 which is now listed on 29.10.2019.

This Court, by the order dated 06.05.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating/Arresting Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Bhushan lal, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation and not required for custodial interrogation, the order dated 06.05.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
