This order shall dispose of the present petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.21 dated 16.03.2018 under Sections 323/324/307/148/149 of Indian Penal Code (offence under Section 307 was added later on), registered at Police Station Bhindi Saidan, District Amritsar (Rural).

It comes out that in this case, Angrej Singh was injured and Dilbag Singh was the eye witness. It also comes out that cross case was also registered for causing injuries to Harpreet Singh and Baldev Singh under Section 326 IPC and some other Sections.

Petitioner was arrested on 27.06.2018 and is in custody since then.

On the last date of hearing, report of the trial Court was called

with respect to the recording of examination of Angrej Singh and Dilbag Singh. In compliance to the last order dated 03.12.2018, the trial Court has reported that both the witnesses have been examined. In this way, material witnesses have been examined. Since it is a case of version and cross-version and the disposal of trial will take time, further detention of the petitioner will serve no purpose. Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of Rs. one lac with one surety of the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court, subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) Petitioner shall surrender his passport before the trial Court, if any, and shall not leave the country without prior intimation to the Court;
- (2) Petitioner shall not directly or indirectly give any inducement or threat or promise to any witness and
- (3) Petitioner shall attend the Court on each and every date of hearing before the trial Court and in case of his absence, trial Court shall be competent to cancel his bail.

Accordingly, the petition stands allowed.
