The petitioner has filed the instant petition with multifarious prayers and one of the issues raised is that appeal before Chief Administrator, though preferred in December, 2018 has not been decided so far. Alongwith appeal, the petitioner has also filed an application for stay of transfer of 50% of the share in the disputed property. The grievance of the petitioner is that neither the appeal nor the application has been decided and in the meantime, if the property is transferred it will frustrate her rights.

After hearing learned counsel for the petitioner, we are of the opinion that instant petition can be disposed of at this stage, without issuance of notice of motion to the other side, on account of the limited direction that we propose to pass. We direct the appellate authority i.e Chief Administrator to take a decision on the appeal preferred by the petitioner within a period of one week from the date of receipt of the certified copy of

this order. In case for some reasons, main appeal cannot be decided, the application for stay shall positively be decided by that date. Both the parties are directed to appear before the appellate authority on 15.5.2019. It shall be the responsibility of the petitioner to apprise the respondents about the date fixed before the appellate authority.

Disposed of in above terms.

In the meantime, the disputed property shall not be alienated till the decision of the stay application.
