The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking anticipatory bail in the event of his arrest in FIR No.67 dated 04.09.2018 under Sections 406 and 498-A IPC registered at Police Station Women, District Police Commissionerate, Ludhiana.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the matter has been compromised between the petitioner and respondent No.2 and pursuant thereto, they have filed a joint petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 seeking divorce by way of mutual consent.

This fact has not been disputed by learned counsel for respondent No.2.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Since the matter has been compromised between the parties, the present petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated October 11, 2018 is made absolute.

However, if required, the petitioner shall continue to join investigation as and when required to do so and shall abide by the terms and conditions, as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
