Report dated 27.11.2018 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1<sup>st</sup>  
Class, Gurugram has been received whereby after recording statements  
of respondent Sandhya and accused/petitioner-Dhananjay, the Court  
has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at  
voluntarily, out of their own free will, without any undue influence,  
coercion or pressure

Pursuant to order dated 15.12.2018 passed by this Court,  
private parties to this petition have put in appearance and during the  
course of interaction with the parties, it transpired that they have  
compromised the matter and resolved to end the dispute. Their joint  
statement regarding compromise has also been recorded.

Heard.

In the light of report of the trial Court and the joint statement made by the parties before this Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offence for which the accused had been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No. 49 dated 21.08.2018 registered at Women Police Station Gurugram, District Gurugram under Sections 323, 376 and 506 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioner is quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
