FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 12.03.2019 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Jagraon has been received whereby after recording statements of Darshan Singh alias Dhanna Singh, Buta Singh, Joginder Singh, Jagtar Singh alias Gogi and Ramandeep Kaur from the complainant side and that of the accused persons namely Mohinder Singh, Paramjit Kaur, Amandeep Singh and Jagga Singh, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Moreover, during the course of interaction with the parties, they have shown their resolve to end the dispute and have made

statements that they have compromised the matter as per compromise (Annexure P3) dated 01.10.2018 and shall abide by the same.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the parties are co-villagers and the offenses for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of Rapat No.19 dated 13.08.2018 (Annexure P1) under Sections 324, 323, 354A, 506, 34 IPC registered in case bearing FIR No.133 dated 11.08.2018 under Sections 452, 324, 323, 354, 506, 148, 149 IPC pertaining to Police Station Hathur, District Ludhiana and all consequences arising out of the said Rapat qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
