The present petition is for quashing of FIR No.399 dated 17.05.2018 (Annexure P-1) under Sections 406, 498-A, 323 and 506 read with Section 34 of the Indian Penal Code registered at Karnal Police Station Civil Lines, on the basis of compromise.

Ms. Amrita Nagpal, Advocate with respondent No.2 in person puts in appearance of her own and filed *vakalatnama* which is taken on record.

Petitioners and complainant along with their counsels have made statement that they have fully settled their present dispute by way of compromise regarding which they have made statements before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court and has sought to accept the settlement placed on the record as Annexure P-8 and accept that they

have signed the same voluntarily without any undue influence, coercion or pressure and abide by both the parties. They have further stated that they do not have objection if the FIR in question is quashed on the basis of this settlement vide order of even date.

Heard.

The petition stands allowed in those terms. In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offence for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '*Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another*' 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '*Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another*' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No. 399 dated 17.05.2018 registered at Karnal Police Station Civil Lines, under Sections 406, 498-A, 323 and 506 read with Section 34 of the Indian Penal Code and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The present petition stands disposed off.
