AVNEESH JHINGAN, J (Oral):

The present contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful disobedience of order dated 10.07.2018 passed by this Court in CWP No.16612 of 2018.

The relevant portion of the order is reproduced below:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner states that he has taken some land in auction which the Gram Panchayat is not permitting him to utilise. In this regard, he has made a representation (Annexure P-5).

After hearing learned counsel for the petitioner and without commenting on the merits of the case, we dispose of the instant petition with a direction to the respondents to consider and decide the representation (Annexure P-5) by passing a speaking order, as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of three weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

Disposed of.”

The respondents have placed on record reply by way of affidavit of Ghanshyam Thori, IAS, Deputy Commissioner, Sangrur annexing order dated 20.11.2018.

In view of reply filed, learned counsel for the petitioner states that no cause of action survives. However, he seeks liberty to avail remedies available in accordance in law, against the order passed.

The contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous, with liberty as prayed for.

Rule issued against the respondent stands discharged.
