Learned counsel for complainant-Sarwan, has filed memo of appearance, on his own, though he has not been impleaded as party. The same is taken on record. Office to tag the same at the appropriate place.

Through this second petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C., petitioner-Satpal @ Satti, has prayed for grant of regular bail in case FIR No. 264 dated 27.10.2018, registered under Section 306 read with Section 34 IPC at Police Station Tanda, District Hoshiarpur.

At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the matter has been compromised in between the parties.

Learned counsel for the complainant fairly conceded that the matter has been compromised in between the parties. He has no objection, if, the instant petition is allowed and the petitioner is released on bail.

Considering overall facts and circumstances, but without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the petition is allowed. Consequently, petitioner-Satpal @ Satti, is ordered to be released on bail pending trial, on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to the satisfaction of trial Court/Duty Magistrate, concerned.
