ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner has sought cancellation of anticipatory bail granted to respondents No. 2 to 6.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that there was cogent evidence against respondents No. 2 to 6, as there were injuries on the person of the deceased indicating that he was forcibly administered aluminium phosphide, which is stated to be the cause of death. He also contends that after grant of anticipatory bail to respondents No.2 to 6 by the trial Court, they have threatened the petitioner.

Heard. In the FIR, which was registered on the complaint of Daljit Kaur, who is the sister of the deceased, it was stated that respondents No. 2 to 6 (accused) had either caused injuries to her brother or her brother had consumed some poisonous substance due to harassment at their hands. Respondents No. 2 to 6 include the wife, father-in-law, mother-in-law and brother-in-law of the deceased. The police, after conducting investigation,

had found respondents No. 2 to 6 to be innocent and a cancellation report was filed. The Magistrate is stated to have taken cognizance of the matter.

A perusal of the postmortem report of the deceased shows that the injuries are only contusions and the cause of death is aluminium phosphide poison.

Respondents No.2 to 6 were found innocent during investigation and only from the oral averments that after grant of anticipatory bail by the trial Court, they have threatened the petitioner, it would not be appropriate to cancel the anticipatory bail granted to them.

Consequently, the petition stands dismissed. However, it is made clear that any observation made herein shall not have any bearing on the merits of the case.
