FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 17.07.2019 of learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Dasuya has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Ranjit Kaur and the accused persons namely Ajay Nayyar, Vijay Nayyar, Amit Kumar, Parveen Kumar and Sukhdeep alias Sukhi, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Learned counsel for the accused/petitioners has made statement that as per instructions received, the parties had given final effect to their agreement settlement/compromise (Annexure P2) and that nothing is due towards anyone on account of this settlement and that the final effect be given to this petition.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the parties to this case are residents of the same very area and the offenses for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.119 dated 18.08.2018 under Sections 323, 324, 354B, 148, 149 IPC pertaining to Police Station Dasuya and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
