MAHABIR SINGH SINDHU, J.(Oral)

The present petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (Cr.P.C.) for taking appropriate action against the respondents and to produce them before the Court in order to facilitate the trial against them.

In response to the notice of motion issued by this Court, reply by way of affidavit of Ms. Harkamal Kaur, PPS, ACP Sahnewal, District Ludhiana on behalf of respondents No.1 to 4 was filed and perusal of the same reveals that at the instance of the petitioner an FIR no.72 dated 19.08.2011 has been registered under Sections 420, 465, 467, 471 and 120-B IPC at Police Station Meharbaan, Ludhiana. Thereafter during investigation accused namely, Des Raj, Sukhwinder Singh and Baljinder Singh were arrested and then report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. was submitted before the

Court of competent jurisdiction on 25.01.2017.

Learned State counsel has apprised the Court that even charges have also been framed in the matter and the case is pending for prosecution evidence. Also contends that two of the co-accused, namely, Ranjit Singh Grewal and Rajinder Singh Grewal have already been declared Proclaimed Offenders by learned Trial Court and necessary action will be taken against them according to law.

In view of the above, no further directions are required to be issued in the matter and the same is disposed off accordingly.

The trial shall be concluded expeditiously and the necessary action be taken in the matter consequent to the order vide which Ranjit Singh Grewal and Rajinder Singh Grewal were declared Proclaimed Offenders.

Needless to say that the above observations, may not be construed as an expression of opinion on merits of the case.
