On 17.05.2019, the following order was passed:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been falsely implicated on account of the fact that Prem Kumar Goyal who is an influential person entertain a grudge on account of news report against him and his son. He further submits that Prem Kumar Goyal got registered FIR No.290 dated 12.11.2018 against the petitioner in which interim bail was granted by this Court in CRM-M-54723 of 2018. When the petitioner went to join the investigation as directed by the High Court, petitioner has been involved in two other cases.

Notice of motion.

On asking of the Court, Mr. Bhupender Beniwal, AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of State of Punjab and seeks time to get instructions.

Adjourned to 08.07.2019.

In the meantime, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to furnishing personal bonds and surety to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer.

However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Gurmeet Singh, has submitted that the petitioner in this case has joined the investigation and he is not required for further custodial interrogation. However, there are serious allegations against the petitioner with regard to forgery of no objection certificate issued by Oriental Bank of Commerce.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the loan has been obtained by Sarabjit Singh and the petitioner is not the beneficiary. He further submits that the petitioner has been falsely implicated.

Without commenting on the merits of the case, interim order dated 17.05.2019 passed by this Court is made absolute. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon by the Investigating Officer.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed.
