**FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)**

Report dated 07.03.2019 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1<sup>st</sup> Class, Ajnala has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Rajwinder Singh and the accused persons namely Manjeet Singh, Harjeet Singh, Kuldeep Singh, Amarjeet Singh, Rasal Singh, Hardev Singh and Paramjit Kaur, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Learned counsel for the complainant/respondent No.2 as well as learned counsel for the accused/petitioners have made statement that as per instructions received, the parties had given final effect to their agreement settlement/compromise deed (Annexure P2) and that nothing

is due towards anyone on account of this settlement and that the final effect be given to this petition.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, the parties to this petition being co-villagers and the fact that the offenses for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in **‘Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another’ 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and **‘Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another’ 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.23 dated 29.01.2014 under Sections 323/324/452/506/427/354/148/149 IPC pertaining to Police Station Lopoke, District Amritsar Rural and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
