Report dated 11.06.2019 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Jalandhar has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Pooja Verma and the accused namely Varinder Kumar alias Vicky, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

A perusal of the records reveals that the parties have given final effect to their agreement settlement/compromise (Annexure P2) and that nothing is due towards anyone on account of this settlement.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the

offences for which the accused has been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.0114 dated 27.08.2016 under Sections 406, 498-A IPC pertaining to Police Station Women Cell, Jalandhar and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioner are quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
