**RAJ SHEKHAR ATTRI, J.(ORAL)**

By invoking Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioners have prayed for quashing of FIR No.0049 dated 07.02.2017, under Sections 406, 498-A and 506 of the Indian Penal Code (for short 'IPC'), registered at Police Station Sector 31, Faridabad and subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise.

In the present case, the FIR was registered on the statement of Deepika Aggarwal wife of Ankur Aggarwal. Now, dispute between the parties has been resolved.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has placed on record the judgment dated 29.09.2018 vide which the petitioners have been granted divorce with mutual consent. Even statement of the parties have also been recorded in that case wherein they accepted the compromise. Copy of the compromise is placed on record as Annexure P-2.

Respondent No.2-Smt. Deepika Aggarwal has submitted her affidavit whereby she admitted the contents of compromise.

Perusal of allegations in the FIR reveals that the present case squarely falls in the category of cases that can be quashed by the High Court, in exercise of its inherent power under Section 482 Cr.P.C. Keeping in view authoritative enunciation of law laid down by Hon'ble the Supreme Court in **'Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another', 2012 (4) R.C.R. (Criminal) 543** and in the light of facts and circumstances discussed hereinbefore, this Court is of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings would amount to abuse of process of law and it is expedient in the interest of justice that the same are put to an end.

For the foregoing reasons, the petition is allowed and FIR No.0049 dated 07.02.2017, under Sections 406, 498-A and 506 IPC, registered at Police Station Sector 31, Faridabad and subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise stands quashed qua petitioners.
