The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 83 dated 21.03.2019, under Sections 466, 467, 468, 471, 406 and 420 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 registered at Police Station Sadar Yamuna Nagar, District Yamuna Nagar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegations against the petitioner in the FIR are that she had pledged land measuring 2 acres (16 kanals) for obtaining an agricultural loan of ₹5,20,000/- from the Punjab National Bank in the year 2013 and she had also pledged this very piece of land to Sarva Haryana Gramin Bank in the year 2016 while obtaining a loan of ₹15,90,000/-. He also contends that the petitioner has defaulted only on one occasion for both the loans and has been regularly paying the instalments. She undertakes to pledge, if necessary, another six acres of land, which is owned by her, in discharge of her financial liability. He further contends that the petitioner is not involved in any other case.

This Court, by the order dated 20.05.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of her arrest, she was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Shishpal, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and keeping in view the fact that the petitioner has joined investigation, the order dated 20.05.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. She shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
