Prayer in the present petition is to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.0047 dated 08.04.2019 registered under Sections 21/29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act at Police Station Naggal, District Ambala.

On 28.05.2019, following order was passed by this Court:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is sought to be implicated on the statement of co-accused before the police which is a weak type of evidence. He further submits that the petitioner is not involved in any other case under Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985. He further submits that recovery from Himmat Singh is only 9.14 gram. On the other hand, learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Dev Raj, has submitted that as on date, the prosecution has not collected any evidence against the petitioner apart from the disclosure statement.

Adjourned to 16.07.2019.

In the meantime, in the event of arrest, the petitioner

shall be released on interim bail subject to furnishing personal bonds and surety to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438 (2), Cr.P.C.”

Thereafter, on 16.07.2019, following order was passed by this

Court:-

“Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Karambir Singh, has submitted that the petitioner has although joined investigation but he be directed to join further investigation.

In view of the aforesaid, petitioner is directed to join investigation on 18.07.2019 at 10:00 AM at Police Station Naggal, District Ambala.

Adjourned to 09.08.2019.”

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Subhash Chand, has submitted that the petitioner has joined investigation, cooperated and not required for further custodial interrogation. It has further been informed to the Court that the petitioner is not involved in any other criminal case under NDPS Act.

In view thereof, interim order dated 28.05.2019 passed by this Court is made absolute.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed.
