By filing the present petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioner has sought anticipatory bail in FIR 112 dated 11.10.2018, under Sections 420 and 120-B IPC, Police Station Kulgarhi, District Ferozepur.

On 17.11.2018, this Court had passed the following order:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is employed as a teacher as is evident from Annexure P-2 and stood separated from her husband, namely, Parvinder Singh. She apprehends her arrest in case FIR No.112 dated 11.10.2018 registered at Police Station Kulgarhi, District Ferozepur at the instance of

complainant-Kuldip Singh for the offences punishable under Sections 420 and 120-B of Indian Penal Code. The allegations relate to the payment of amount to the husband of the petitioner who had promised to send Jagjit Singh and Sukhwinder Singh respective brother and friend of complainant to send them abroad. It is contended that complainant and husband of the petitioner are closely related and the amount was transferred in the account of Parvinder Singh.

Meanwhile, the petitioner shall join the investigation and would come present as and when called for and in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be admitted to interim bail on her furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that in pursuance of the order dated 17.11.2018, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel on instructions of HC Talwinder Singh submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and she is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the above, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 17.11.2018, is made absolute.

The petition stands allowed.
