The present contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful disobedience of the order dated 17.7.2017 passed by this Court in Criminal Misc. No. M-25172 of 2017. The operative part of the said order is reproduced below:

“Having considered the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioners and perusal of record, respondent No. 2-Director General of Police, Punjab, is directed to look into the complaints dated 1.2.2017/23.2.2017 (Annexure P4) and take required action, if any, as per law.

With the aforesaid observations made and directions issued, the present petition stands disposed of.”

order dated 13.9.2019 filed in Court is taken on record. Copy thereof has

been handed over to learned counsel for the petitioner.

As per the order, the allegations made by the petitioner were not found correct and it was decided that no cognizable offence is made out.

In view of the reply filed, learned counsel for the petitioner states that no cause of action survives for pursuing the present contempt petition, however, he seeks liberty to avail remedies available in accordance with law against the order dated 13.9.2019.
