Present petition under Section 439 of the Criminal Procedure
Code has been filed for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case F.I.R.
No.99 dated 26.07.2016 under Sections 302, 307, 452, 148, 149, 324 of the
Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Haibowal, District Police
Commissionerate.

Learned counsel representing the petitioner contended that as
per last order dated 08.01.2019, copy of statement of complainant-Baljit
Singh was to be placed on file. The examination-in-chief of Baljit Singh has

been recorded before learned trial Court, but he has not uttered even a single word against the present petitioner. Moreso, co-accused Neeraj Sharma alias Ashu has also been admitted to bail by this Court vide order dated 16.11.2018 passed in CRM-M No.47601 of 2018 and petitioner is seeking parity with said co-accused Neeraj Sharma alias Ashu. The petitioner is in custody since 06.11.2017, trial of the case still to take some more time and no useful purpose would be served by detaining him behind the bar, so he be released on bail.

Learned State counsel has affirmed the fact that complainant-Baljit Singh in his statement as PW1 has not said anything against the present petitioner and that co-accused Neeraj Sharma alias Ashu has already been admitted to bail in this case.

Having considered the submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner and the fact that the petitioner is in custody since 06.11.2017, complainant-Baljit Singh has not uttered a word against the present petition, co-accused Neeraj Sharma alias Ashu has already been admitted to bail vide order dated 16.11.2018 passed by this Court in CRM-M No.47601 of 2018, trial of the case still to take some more time and no useful purpose would be served by detaining the petitioner behind the bar any more, the present petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be admitted on regular bail on furnishing adequate bail bond and surety bond to the satisfaction of concerned learned trial Judge/ Chief Judicial Magistrate/ Duty Magistrate.
