The petitioners are the unfortunate parents and the sister of deceased of Satish Kumar, Constable in Haryana Police who died on 26.06.2015 due to electrocution. A writ petition was filed claiming compensation. The writ petition was disposed of on 18.07.2018. The respondents were to award compensation to the petitioners by applying the formula, being applied by the Motor Accident Claims Tribunal in case of death, i.e. by assessing the income of the deceased and applying the multiplier in accordance with the age of the deceased and after deducting 1/3rd of the income as expenditure to be incurred by the deceased. The needful was to be done by the respondents within three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

Reply on behalf of the respondents filed in Court is taken on record, copy handed over to learned counsel for the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that though amount

of Rs. 35,53,068/- has been paid to the petitioners for compensation but the calculations have not been provided.

Learned counsel for the respondents submits that calculations shall be provided within four weeks from today to learned counsel for the petitioners.

In view of the statement made today in Court, no cause of action survives for pursuing the present contempt petition. The contempt petition is disposed of. However, the petitioners would be at liberty to avail remedies in accordance with law, if aggrieved of the calculations of compensation.

Disposed of with liberty as prayed for.
