FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

This order shall dispose off the petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. filed by petitioners Dr.Inderjeet Singh Sarao and Dr. Balbir Kaur Sarao seeking quashing of the FIR (Annexure P1) and all consequences arising out of it on the basis of settlement/compromise deed dated 10.09.2018 (Annexure P3).

Learned counsel for the complainant/respondent No.2 as well as learned counsel for the accused/petitioners have made statement that as per instructions received, the parties had given final effect to their agreement settlement/compromise (Annexure P3) and that nothing is due towards anyone on account of this settlement and that the final effect be given to this petition.

Heard.

In the light of the stand of learned counsel for both the sides and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offenses for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.8 dated 03.05.2017 under Sections 406, 498-A IPC pertaining to Police Station NRI Cell, Jalandhar and all consequences arising out of the said FIR in respect of the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
