MANOJ BAJAJ, J.

By filing the present petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioner has sought anticipatory bail in FIR No.218 dated 24.10.2018 registered under Sections 452, 323, 427, 506 and 148 read with Section 149 of the Indian Penal Code at Police Station City Ferozepur, District Ferozepur.

In response to the order dated 17.12.2018, an affidavit of Pritam Singh, PPS, Senior Superintendent of Police, Ferozepur, District Ferozepur has been filed in the Court which is taken on record. It is indicated in the affidavit that opinion delivered by the doctor mentions all the injuries are simple in nature.

On 29.11.2018 this Court had passed the following order:-

“Notice of motion for 17.12.2018.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to surrender before the Arresting/Investigating Officer within seven days. On doing so, he shall be released on interim bail,

subject to his furnishing bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, he shall abide by the terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. failing which he shall loose the benefit of interim bail allowed to him.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that in pursuance of the order dated 29.11.2018, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Tarlok Singh submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and he is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the above, the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 29.11.2018, is made absolute.

The petition stands allowed.
