TEJINDER SINGH DHINDSA, J. (ORAL)

As per pleadings on record, petitioner No.1 got married to respondent No.4 on 31.10.2017.

Petitioners No.4 to 6 are the close relatives of petitioner No.1.

Counsel submits that the matrimonial relationship between petitioner No.1 and respondent No.4 has run into rough weather. Respondent No.4 who otherwise was resident of Abohar, State of Punjab had filed a complaint in pursuance to which the petitioners, who are residents of State of Rajasthan and State of Uttar Pradesh, are being summoned repeatedly by the police authorities at Abohar as also being harassed and humiliated.

Writ of mandamus has been sought seeking issuance of directions to official respondents No.2 and 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners from private respondents.

Having heard counsel for the petitioners and having perused the pleadings on record and without even ascertaining the correctness of the averments made in the petition, I deem it appropriate to dispose of the instant writ petition in terms of granting liberty to petitioner No.1 to

approach respondent No.3 i.e. the Station House Officer, Police Station City-I Abohar as regards the apprehension and threat that has been voiced in the instant writ petition.

In the eventuality of any such application being moved by petitioner No.1, respondent No.3 would be obligated to look into the matter and to thereafter take steps as he may deem fit in accordance with law.
