Petitioner-Harjit Ram @ Jeeta has filed the present petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail pending trial in case FIR No. 60 dated 07.07.2018, under Section 22 of NDPS Act, registered at Police Station Banaur, District Patiala. The petitioner is in custody since his arrest on 07.7.2018.

As per the prosecution, when the police party was on patrolling duty, one person was seen coming from the side of Tepla, who was carrying a bag type carrybag in his hand alongwith a lady, who upon seeing the police perplexed and tried to turn back. They both were apprehended and upon suspicion, search was conducted after completion of formalities,

recovery of 10800 intoxicant tablets Lomotil, 264 intoxicant capsules Spasmo Proxivon and 525 intoxicant tablets Becalm was effected.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the investigation of the case is complete and co-accused (wife of the petitioner) has already been released on bail. He contends that no witness has been examined by the prosecution so far and therefore the trial will take some time for its completion.

On the other hand, learned State counsel, who is assisted by HC Karnail Singh opposed the prayer on the ground that the petitioner is also involved in similar other case, which is pending.

Considering the above and the quantity of contraband recovered from the petitioner, no case for grant of bail to the petitioner is made out.

The petition is dismissed.
