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**GURVINDER SINGH GILL, J (ORAL)**

1. This order shall dispose of the aforesaid two petitions filed on behalf of Anil Kumar, Neeta Kanojia and Hemant Kumar seeking grant of anticipatory bail in a case registered against them vide FIR No.108 dated 18.10.2018, registered at Police Station Women Police Ambala, District Ambala, under Sections 323, 406, 498-A and 506 of IPC.
2. The FIR was registered at the instance of respondent No.2-Ms. Ameet Guglani. During the course of pendency of these petitions, the parties were referred to Mediation & Conciliation Centre of this Court wherein, the matter was amicably resolved. Subsequently, learned counsel for the

parties had submitted before this Court on the previous dates as regards the modalities of the compromise, as agreed upon amongst the parties.

3. Today, the petitioners alongwith their counsel as well as the complainant are present in person. The petitioners as well as complainant have informed that pursuant to the compromise effected amongst them, the parties had filed a petitioner under Section 13B of the Hindu Marriage Act, which stands accepted and that the marriage between the parties stands dissolved vide judgment and decree dated 06.11.2019. The complainant present in the Court, has submitted that she has no objection for grant of anticipatory bail in view of the amicable settlement amongst the parties.
4. In view of the aforestated position, custodial interrogation of the petitioners would not be warranted as the parties have resolved their issues and have in fact got their marriage dissolved. The petitions, as such, are accepted and the interim directions issued by this Court vide orders dated 30.11.2018 in CRM-M-52812-2018 and 10.04.2019 in CRM-M-539-2019 are hereby made absolute subject to the condition that the petitioners shall join investigation as and when called upon to do so and cooperate with the Investigating Officer and shall also abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
