The present petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.119 dated 19.05.2018 registered under Sections 420 and 406 of the Indian Penal Code at Police Station Talwandi Sabo, District Bathinda.

On 01.12.2018, while issuing notice of motion the following order was passed by this Court:

“ Contends that in terms of the order dated 01.06.2018,

passed by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Bathinda petitioner had joined the investigation but ultimately his pre arrest bail has been declined finally on 19.11.2018 and he is still ready to cooperate with the investigation agency in the matter.

Notice of motion for 14.01.2019.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation before the Investigating Officer. In the event of his arrest, the Arresting Officer would admit him to interim bail till the next date of hearing on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to his satisfaction. The petitioner is also directed to abide by all the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that in terms of the order dated 01.12.2018, the petitioner has joined investigation and his custodial interrogation is no longer required.

On instructions from ASI Baldev Singh, the above factual position is duly acknowledged by learned State counsel and stated that the custodial interrogation of the petitioner is no longer required.

In view of the above, the order dated 01.12.2018 is made absolute subject to the provisions of Section 438(2) Cr. P.C.

Petition stands disposed off.
