Petitioner Ajay Kumar has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.57 dated 03.04.2019, registered at Police Station Maulijagan, Chandigarh, under Section 21 of the NDPS Act, 1985.

Notice of motion has been issued.

Learned counsel for U.T. Chandigarh appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned counsel for U.T. Chandigarh and gone through the record.

Recovery from the present petitioner is stated to be about 50.20 grams of heroin, which falls in non-commercial quantity.

Learned counsel for U.T. Chandigarh states that there are two more cases against the present petitioner.

The petitioner has been in custody since 04.04.2019. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial

custody. The trial of the case may take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping him in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
