The dispute is with regard to validity of the agreement to sell.

The petitioner claims that it is a forged one. He relies upon opinion of a handwriting and fingerprint expert. In the considered view of this Court, primarily the dispute is of civil nature and there is no finding of the Civil

Court that the agreement to sell is forged.

Hence, no case is made out to issue direction to respondent

No.2 under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
