Through this petition, the petitioner has sought for issuance of a direction to respondents No.3 and 4 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner at the hands of respondents No.5 to 8, who are alleged to be maniac kind of persons and may cause any harm and injury or may cause death to the petitioner as well as her family members.

Reply by way of affidavit of Deputy Superintendent of Police, Nabha, was filed by the State on behalf of respondents No.1 to 4. Thereafter, the matter was adjourned on the request of the learned counsel for private respondents vide order dated 26.9.2017. Neither any reply has been filed by private respondents nor there is any representation on behalf of the petitioner or private respondents.

The reply filed by the State shows that the dispute is relating to a piece of land over which the petitioner claims her right, whereas, the other party claims that the land was given to the Potters for heating heaps for making of mud pots. The affidavit also states that the matter is pending

before the Block Development and Panchayat Officer for conducting demarcation of the said land.

In view of the above, since there is no threat to life and liberty of the petitioner and the matter was already sent to the appropriate authority for demarcation, therefore, this Court does not find any necessity to pass any further order in this case.

Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed.
