Petitioner-Sahil Kaushal has prayed for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.219 dated 30.06.2017 under Section 22 of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 Act registered at Police Station Sector-34, Chandigarh.

On 30.06.2017, when the Police party was on patrol duty, a young boy was coming from Sector-33 Chandigarh. Upon seeing police, he turned backward. Then police officers apprehended him and after formalities, the search was conducted. A red polythene bag was found from his hand and upon search 20 injections of buprenorphine each containing 2 ml and 20 injection pheniramine maleate each containing 10 ml total 40 injections were recovered.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case. According to him, the further custody of the petitioner may not be justified as the trial is progressing at a

very slow pace as only 06 witnesses have been examined.

On the other hand, learned counsel for U.T. opposed the prayer for grant of bail on the ground that the contraband recovered from the petitioner falls within the commercial quantity. As per custody certificate, it is pointed out that 22 other FIRs are also pending against the petitioner under IPC and NDPS Act, 1985. This is a third regular bail application of the petitioner. Earlier, petitions were dismissed by this Court vide orders dated 31.05.2018 and 11.12.2018.

Considering the above as well as his involvement in other cases, this Court does not find any ground to extend the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

The petition is dismissed.
