AVNEESH JHINGAN, J. (Oral)

The present contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful disobedience of the order dated 5.10.2018 passed by this Court in CWP No. 25664 of 2018. The operative part of the said order is reproduced below:

“3. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No. 2-Director, Public Instructions (Sec.), Punjab, Sector 62 Mohali to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioners in legal notice dated 30.5.2018 (P-14) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order in the light of judgments referred to above in para No. 1 of this order, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

4. However, if petitioners still feel aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, they shall be at

liberty to have recourse to other remedies available under law including to approach this Court.”

Short reply dated 26.9.2019 by way of affidavit of Mr. Sukhjeet Pal Singh, Director Public Instructions (Secondary Education), Punjab annexing order dated 21.6.2019 filed in Court is taken on record, copy handed over to learned counsel for the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that in view of the reply filed, no cause of action survives for pursuing the contempt petition.

Disposed of as infructuous. However, the petitioners would be at liberty to avail remedies available in accordance with law, as granted by the writ court.
